CHECK UP:

Memory Work Review: Be careful not to practice your righteousness in front of others to be seen by them. If you do, you will have no reward from your Father in heaven.

- Matthew 6:1

- What did you do with last week's text on "not doing your good deeds for the purpose of being seen"?

OPEN:

 How intentional are you in your prayer life? (considering both the content and regularity of your prayers)

READ and ASK: Matthew 6:7-15

- What are some right and wrongs of prayer that Jesus mentions in this passage?
 - o How have you seen people "babble" or have empty words in prayer?
- What does it teach us about prayer that God knows what we need before we even ask him?
- Does Jesus say this prayer is a "what to" or a "how to" prayer?
 - o What is the difference?
 - o What does it say about our intentionality in prayer?
- What insights or facts about God are revealed in this passage?
- What does it communicate to us that Jesus taught us to pray as "our Father" rather than "my Father?"
- How are we to approach God? (balancing calling God, Father, and as "hallowed")

- What does it mean for us to pray for God's kingdom to come and for God's will to be done?
 - What does it communicate about our posture before God (not just in prayer but in life)?
- What should our attitude be toward life's necessities?
 - o Why is that especially difficult in our culture?
- What should be our attitude towards temptation?
- What does it say about our hearts if we refuse to forgive people who have wronged us?
 - How does remembering God's mercy and grace compel us to forgive others?

APPLY:

- How do you need to be more intentional in your prayer life?
- NEXT STEP: What changes to you need to make in your prayer life this week?

Memory Work:

This, then, is how you should pray:

'Our Father in heaven, hallowed be your name,
