Week's Reading: Deuteronomy 6:1-9  
Discussion Guide: December 12, 2021

**CHECK UP:**

Memory Work Review: But he said to me, "My grace is sufficient for you, for my power is made perfect in weakness." Therefore I will boast all the more gladly about my weaknesses, so that Christ's power may rest on me. - 2 Corinthians 12:9

Did you make any effort towards overcoming weakness together this past week?

**OPEN:**

- How has your Christian life benefited from others? How has together been better for you?
- How do you think most people define "leaving a legacy?"

**READ and ASK:** Psalm 90:12, Deuteronomy 6:1-9, Psalm 78:5-8, Ephesians 6:1-4

- What does it mean to lead and leave a Christ-centered legacy?
- How does "numbering your days" help in leading a Christ-centered life?
- Respond to this phrase, "legacy is embodied in individuals, but formed in community"?
- Why is starting at home essential in leading a Christ-centered legacy?
  - o Respond to this quote by Charles Spurgeon, "What a man is at home, that he is, and though he be saint abroad, if he be a devil at home, you may depend upon it that the last is his real character."
- How is together better in leading and leaving a legacy?

**APPLY:**

- Perhaps the two most likely factors in passing on a Christ-centered legacy to the next generation is parents leading a life of faith, and having at least one other Christian who instills the same biblical values that parents are teaching (*notice the greatest factor in leading a legacy is not removing the negative influences but being the positive ones*).
  - o How can you be a part of that? What challenges you about that?

- The challenge of Deuteronomy 6 is to know God's ways, live God's ways, and to share God's ways. What needs the most attention in your life?
- What can this group do to be better together to lead a legacy?
- NEXT STEP(S): What specific step do you need to take this week in order to lead a Christ-centered legacy?
