This week's reading: Exodus 1-4
Discussion Guide: November 24, 2024

CHECK UP:

Memory Work: Finally, brothers and sisters, whatever is true, whatever is noble, whatever is right, whatever is pure, whatever is lovely, whatever is admirable—if anything is excellent or praiseworthy—think about such things. – Philippians 4:8

How did you struggle and succeed with guarding against sin this past week?

OPEN:

- What was a highlight in your week this past week? What was a particular challenge you had?
- Who did you B.L.E.S.S. this past week? What action steps did you take?

READ and ASK: Exodus 3:1-14; Matthew 28:18-20; 2 Timothy 1:7

- Why do you think God appeared to Moses through a burning bush?
- How does the name "I AM" uniquely identify God?
 - o How does Jesus later take that name on himself? (John 8:58-59) What are the implications of that?
- What does God call Moses to do?
- What do you make of God's series of information in verses 7-10? (I have seen the misery of my people, I am concerned, I have come down to rescue, I am sending you).
 - o How do you see God still operating like that in the New Testament and in our lives?
- How does Moses respond to God's instruction?
 - o How do you at times respond like that?
 - o What is at stake if we don't answer God's call to go?

APPLY:

- How do you need to trust and obey the call of God on your life (Matthew 4:19, 28:18-20)
 - o NEXT STEP: How do you need to act in obedience to God's call on your life this week?
