You Asked For It...

This week's reading: Genesis 2:18-25, Romans 1:18-27, 1 Corinthians 6:9-11, 1 Timothy 1:8-11, Matthew 9:9-13, 1 Timothy 1:15-17

Discussion Guide: May 19, 2024

CHECK UP:

Memory work: This is good, and pleases God our Savior, who wants all people to be saved and to come to a knowledge of the truth. - 1 Timothy 2:3-4

Did you preach the gospel to yourself this past week? How did you do that?

OPEN:

- Who did you B.L.E.S.S. this past week? What action steps did you take?
- Why do you think discussions around the topic of LGBTQ+ is such a challenging/loaded/hot discussion?

READ and ASK (objective questions): Genesis 2:18-25; Romans 1:18-27; 1 Corinthians 6:9-11; 1 Timothy 1:8-11

- As Christians our goal is to be faithful to God's word. What does God's word teach on the subject of homosexuality?
 - o What is God's intention for human sexuality?
- Have you ever heard any "revisionist" view of some of these texts (or similar texts)? (a revisionist view is a view that seeks to change the meaning of what is clearly taught in a text).
 - Have you handled or thought about situations where you have been confronted with revisionist views?
- How should we think about this difficult subject when our emotions get in the way or when we have a loved one who identifies as LGBTQ+?

READ and ASK (relational questions): Matthew 9:9-13; 1 Timothy 1:15-17; John 1:14; Luke 19:10

- What does it look like to be both gracious and truthful?
- How was Jesus both truthful and gracious at the same time?
 - o How can we do that?
 - How is Jesus a model for us on this subject?

- How do you think the church (the broad American church) has handled the subject of LGBTQ+ topics well?
 - o How do you think the church has handled these topics poorly?
- Often times, we (Christians) have cared more about winning an argument that winning people to Christ. How have you seen that?
 - o How should we combat that?
 - Why is compromising on the biblical position of LGBTQ+ not helpful in winning people to Christ?
 - Why do we get so defensive sometimes when the world lives like the world? (see 1 Corinthians 5:12-13)

APPLY:

- Do you tend to care more about winning an argument or winning people to Christ?
- Do you tend to error on the side of grace or truth?
- Next step(s): How do you need to conform your mind to the biblical view of sexuality or view those far from Christ as lost people to be found? (See Romans 12:2)

Memory Work:
